## **Who should apply for Financial aid?**

**EVERYONE!** The application is **FREE!** If your family's income is too high, you may not receive need-based aid, but you could still qualify for scholarships, grants and low-interest student loans as well as work study.

Paper applications for the **FAFSA** which stands for **Free Application for Federal Student Aid**—are available in the College & Career Center now. However, the preferred mode is applying on-line at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Benefits to applying on-line are simple—fewer errors are made and the financial aid is processed faster than paper applications. Students and parents can go on-line now to [www.pin.ed.gov](http://www.pin.ed.gov) and get a PIN (Personal Identification Number) to begin the process for applying for financial aid.

**The application filing period for the FAFSA is January 1, 2008-March 2, 2008.**

Financial aid packages come in the spring before students are required to submit their “letter of intent” to enroll in a specific school. This way students and their families can look over the different financial aid packages between the schools and choose the one that works best with their financial situation.

There are numerous scholarships and grants available—at the national, state and local levels; this is money students *never* have to pay back. Last year's seniors earned over \$6 million dollars in scholarships and grants, money they never have to pay back.

Furthermore, The College & Career Center produces a monthly scholarship bulletin notifying seniors of upcoming scholarships and the due dates. In addition, we also have scholarship booklets available for our local scholarships due March 1. Look for our new booklets in January.

Seniors—we need your Social Security Numbers to submit your GPA for the Cal Grants to the State of California. If you have a 2.0 GPA or higher and have financial need, you could be eligible for up to \$10,000/year for college.

## Cal Grant—Free Money for College

For those students choosing to attend institutions of higher learning in California may qualify for up to \$10,000 in grant money if your family has financial need!

The Cal Grant Program was developed by Governor Davis to encourage California residents with a 2.0 or higher grade point average to further their education beyond high school; the funding includes all 2 year, 4 year, trade schools, public and private institutions.

Samohi submits the **Grade Point Average Verifications** *electronically* to the government in California. **n order for you to be eligible for the Cal Grants, we must have your social security number on file in our college data base!**

*If you did not fill out your social security number on our college information sheet during registration, come into the College Center now and see Mrs. Flores!*

**Deadline to turn in your SSN is Friday, January 25, 2008!**

## Many Private Colleges Require Additional Financial Aid information!

Remember to fill out the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE! Many private institutions require this in addition to the FAFSA to come up with a financial aid package to attract students to their schools. The PROFILE is a service of the College Board which connects colleges, universities, professional schools and scholarship programs use the information on the PROFILE to help these institutions award non federal student aid funds. By completing the PROFILE, you provide the colleges with a complete picture of your family's financial circumstances.

To register for the PROFILE go to [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com)

- Click on CSS/PROFILE under "Pay for College"
- Click on 2008-09 PROFILE
- Click on Register for PROFILE
- Begin filling out the form and submit when finished at least 2 weeks before the earliest priority filing date specified by your colleges and programs

All students are charged \$25 for the initial application— this covers the cost of creating your PROFILE application and the first school report—each school you wish to send your PROFILE to is an additional \$16.
